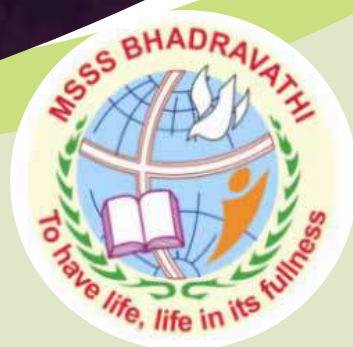

ORGANIZATIONAL PROFILE

Malnad Social Service Society (MSSS) is a non-profit, secular and non-political organization registered in 1991 under the Karnataka Societies Registration Act, 1960 (Reg No. 219/SOR/SMG/90-91) and Foreign Contribution Regulation Act under the Ministry of Home Affairs. It is registered under 12A and has 80G Tax exemption under Income Tax Act 1961. The operational area includes the Shimoga and Chikmagalur Districts in the state of Karnataka.

It is the social face of the Syro Malabar Diocese of Bhadravathi in Karnataka for facilitating a harmonious society rooted in the gospel values of love, justice, happiness and peace. MSSS has set its spectrum of activities through multi-ethnic and multi-religious with the objective to restore the dignity and potential of marginalized individuals. It began its social work in a charity mode and gradually

shifted to welfare and developmental modes. At present MSSS undertakes different Social development activities like education, health and human development activities including empowerment of rural poor, through the process of sensitization, capacity building, training and exposure with an integrated, need based and right based approaches. MSSS is giving importance to sustainable livelihood development of the rural families and caters to the needs of the people living with HIV/AIDS and Cancer.

The MSSS collaborates, associates and builds strong mutually beneficial networks with like-minded organizations and Government agencies for the betterment of the society at large. The participatory functioning of the Society is guided by its vision and mission based on the Gospel values under the guidance of the governing body.

ONGOING PROGRAMMES

1. WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMME (WEP)

The MSSS employs paramount importance to the cause of empowerment of women in an integrated manner which can be vividly contemplated in the vision of this organization. It is designed to increase the degree of autonomy and self-determination and to enable them to represent their interests in a responsible and self-determined manner. WEP is a project assumed from KROSS and it tasks to augment and ameliorate the social, economic, political psychological and legal power of women so as to ensure equal rights to women and make them confident to claim their entitlements and live a life with a sense of self respect and dignity.

The maximization of the women participation in the local institutions forms the predominant policy of the organization in order to empower

and animate them in our operational areas to be effective leaders of the society. The women are coordinated into community based organization in order to amplify their socio-economic capabilities. The overall goal of this project is to invigorate the self determination and autonomy of the women from particularly marginalized sections of society such as dalits and indigenous people. Now they are able to jointly claim their rights from family as well as from society. The program from 01.01.2019 to 31.12.2019 has been completed and successfully achieving the desired results and completing the internal and external evaluation of the program by the donors. The follow up of the IV Phase program scheduled from 01.01.2019 are under progress in order to achieve the goal and objectives of the organization to empower the women.

2. WOMEN IN MICRO ENTERPRISES (WME)

The very name of the project indicates its purpose of encouraging entrepreneurship among the women of the marginalized communities. The MSSS collaborates with SAMRUDI Rural Upliftment Foundation - Bangalore for the benefits of the women of economically most marginalized communities. Through this project loan is disbursed among the families through SHGs upto Rs. 25000 with lowest interest and service charges and affordable repayment installments. It aims to elucidate and motivate the latent businesswoman in the women of the marginalized communities. The SAMRUDI Foundation does this noble work as a service to the community.

3. CHILD HELP LINE - 1098

The **CHILD HELPLINE** is a 24 hours toll-free phone service launched by the Government of India during the year 1998 – 1999, which can be accessed by a child in distress or an adult on his/her behalf by dialing the number 1098 on telephone. Child line provides emergency assistance to a child and subsequently, based upon the child's need, the child is referred to an appropriate organization for short-term or long-term follow up and care. It aims to create a Child Protection Network to reach out to every child in crisis intervention and link to long term comprehensive development. The MSSS is a Collaborative Unit of this noble cause since April 2011.



Vision

“A child friendly nation that guarantees the rights and protection of all children”



Mission:

CHILDLINE will reach out to every child in need and ensure their rights and protection through the four Cs, Connect, Catalyze, Collaborate and Communicate.

The service focuses on the needs of children living alone on the streets, child laborers working in unorganized sector, domestic workers and sexually abused children.

1. To provide a platform for networking among organizations and to strengthen the support systems which facilitate the rehabilitation for children especially in difficult circumstances.

2. To respond to children in emergency situations and refer them to relevant Governmental and Non-Governmental Organizations

Basic Objectives of ChildLine Service

3. To sensitize the public hospitals, municipal corporations and the railways towards the problems faced by these children.

4. To provide an opportunity to public to respond to the needs of children in difficult circumstances.

5. To create a structure which ensures the protection of the rights of the child as ratified in the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child and The Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000.

Since the commencement of CHILD LINE Shimoga on 1st April 2011, it has played a very remarkable role in every aspect of extending immediate help and support to the child in distress. It responds invariably to every child who dials 1098 and provides emergency assistance through intervention and long term follow up. The collaborative organization responds to all incoming calls, 24 x 7 and renders the necessary aid. The Collab organization also responds when a concerned adult informs it about a child in need of care and protection. The primary role of the CHILD LINE Collab organization is to ensure effective networking and training of organizations associated with CHIDLINe and it ensures that the issues faced in responding to calls are addressed for effective functioning of the service.

CHIDLINe being a city based program covers the entire Shimoga city and at times, it does intervene to cases received from beyond its jurisdiction; depending on the urgency of the cases. CHILD LINE Shimoga has a decade of its functioning in Shimoga and has played crucial

role towards addressing the need of children in distress.

Call statistics and case intervention:-

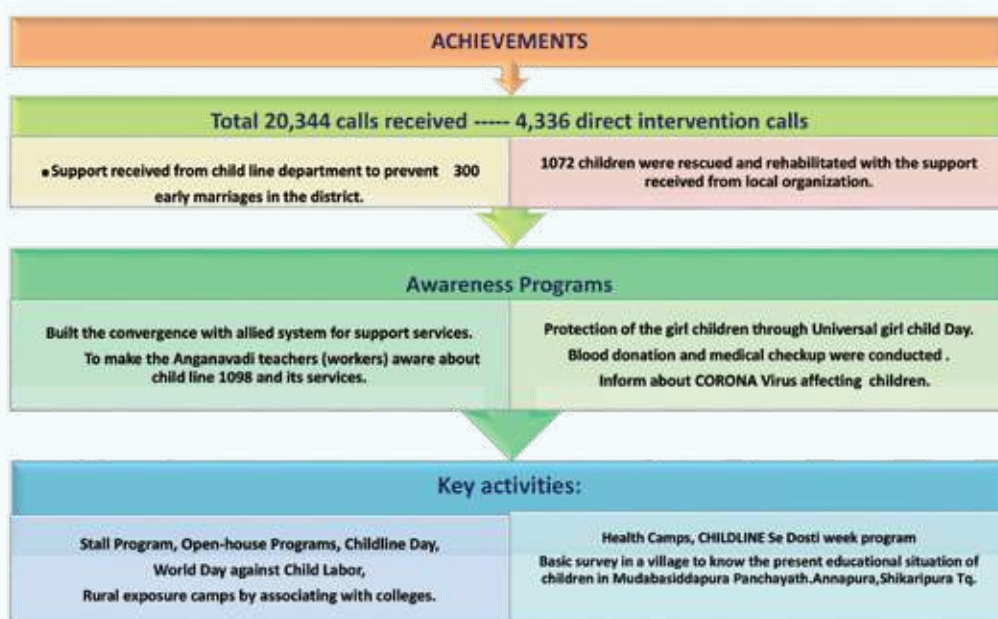
As every call is important, Child line responds to each and every call based on child line's credo. Since its inception, CHILD LINE Shimoga has been receiving call from children as well as concerned adult responding cases of children in distress. CHIDLINe aims at protecting the rights of children and ensuring access to quality service to the children who are in need of care and protection.

CHIDLINe Shimoga has been able to render quality service to the children who contacted 1098 for various needs such as medical assistance, shelter, repatriation, emotional support and guidance, tracking missing children, intervening with children who have been physically or sexually abused, providing sponsorship and other interventions on child rights violations. 4. NAVAJEEVAN COMMUNITY CARE CENTRE

MSSS initiated a Community care programme since a decade and with the sole intention to increase access to better quality of life and to reduce vulnerability through improving clinical and care services, linking to develop relevant social service and community responses for the people living with HIV/AIDS (PLHIVs).

OBJECTIVES

Strengthen family and community care, through increased psychosocial support to the individual, improve access to and adherence to Anti Retroviral Treatment (ART)

Form a bridge between hospital and home care. A person living with HIV needs, more than medicines or hospitals, the means to cope with his physical stress, mental agony, social, psychological and spiritual conditions.

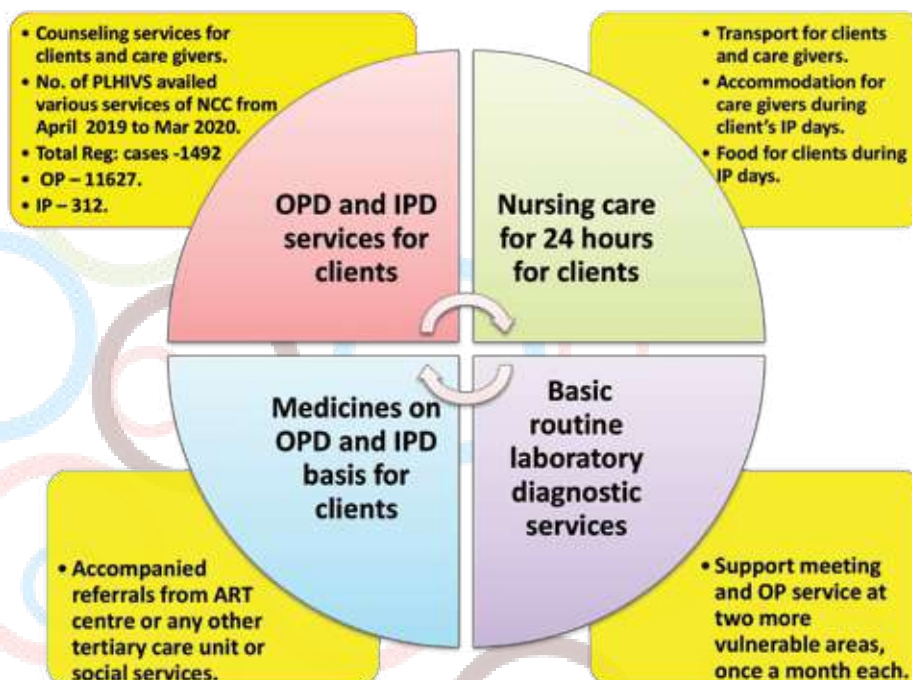
Averting the spread of HIV and AIDS through sensitization and empowerment.

5. BALABHAVANS MAINTENANCE

Despite the various planning and special provision for accelerated socio-economic development of neglected sections of the society by the various agencies, the issues of orphans and girl children remains unaddressed and unsolved. It is at this juncture that the Malnad Social Service Society under the effective leadership and patronage of Bishop Mar Joseph Arumachadath of Bhadravathi Diocese is focusing on the holistic growth of the children from the different strata of the society. Presently MSSS manages two such houses catering to the overall development of the children.

ST. ALPHONSA BLALBHAVAN-UMBLEBYLU

It is a shelter for the girl children located at Umblebylu, about 20 Km from Shimoga city. The proficient directorship of Rev. Fr. Abraham Areeparambil and the able warden-ship of Rev. Sr.Kalpana facilitate the smooth functioning of the house. The management takes care of the expenses incurred in the accommodation,

food and education. Children who are from poor walks of life, semi-orphans and children under family problems are accommodated here. They attend their classes at the nearby Government Schools ranging from III Std to X Std. This year there are 32 students in the house. Two teaching and three non-teaching staff take care of the daily needs. The intended holistic growth for the children is achieved by organizing co-curricular activities on a regular basis which includes motivational and moral classes, seminar on health and hygiene and learning through games and interactive sessions. This has been an impetus for the children to grow in the different aspects of the life and have a positive approach towards life. The eagerness to grow enables the staff to work tirelessly for the children. The birthdays and the festivals irrespective of religion are celebrated to the full happiness of the children. The generous monetary support provided by the agency Kindermission-werk Germany and CNEW are the great support to accomplish such empathetic endeavours.

ST. ANTONY'S BALABHAVAN - EDUVALLY

This house which serves as a dwelling for the boys and girls was the brain child of late Fr. Mathew Kizhakemury of MCBS which was founded 30 years ago and since the last 11 years it is under the care and management of MSSS. It is located at Iduavally, a village 25 km away from Sagar Taluk of Shimoga. The experienced directorship of Fr. Saji and the girls In charge Rev. Sr. Rosily serve as a source of growth for the children. It is a co-head accommodation for the orphans and financially backward children aging up to X Std. Presently there are 65 inmates staying in the house who are provided

with accommodation, food, dress and educational expenses. There is a staff nurse to monitor the health related needs of the children. The support of warden Sumithra and brother Abhilash plays a vital role in the discipline and management of the house. The appointed teacher helps and observes the children with regard to their studies in the house. The domestic staff takes care of the day today needs. The children are provided with healthy food. The munificent financial help provided by CNEW - Kakkanad is a great support to run this orphanage in a smooth manner.



6. MAZDOOR SURAKSHA YOJANA

Mazdoor Suraksha Yojana is an initiative of Workers India Federation and Labour Commission of Catholic Bishops Conference of India, which is an insurance linked pension scheme for unorganized workers especially in the field of Agriculture and self employed or daily laborers.

It is a Government guaranteed retirement pension scheme named Swavalamban having central government subsidy of Rs. 1000 per year with a minimum contribution from the pensioners such as Rs.100 or above up to Rs. 12000. MSSS with the support of Workers India Federation got enrolled 543 pensioners in this scheme and as on date 269 members have renewed their contribution.

7. SIGHT TO THE BLIND

The month of September and October 2019 envisioned the 'Sight to the Blind' programme. It includes organising free eye check up camps and distribution of the spectacles. We have conducted free eye

check up in different parts of our diocese. It includes N.R. Pura, Tharikere, Arahatholalu, Gouligere, Umblebylu, Rippenpete, Induvalli, Iduvalli, Anavatti, Bommanakatte etc. The eye specialist Dr. Padbanaban along with his 3 member's team was a helping hand to MSSS to conduct the eye check up. At some places Dr. Padbanaban was also present to distribute the spectacles.

In collaboration with India Vision Institute – Chennai, we have conducted such camps at different locations which have benefitted many people. Under this programme more than 10,000 beneficiaries got their eyes tested. Among these 2100 people were diagnosed with eyesight problems and they were given the needed specs freely which would approximately cost 20,00,000.

SPARSHA is a campaign against cancer under the banner of Caritas India, New Delhi. It has the charism of instilling hope in the people battling against this disease. It emphasizes on beating the illness with a change in lifestyle. The aim of this project is to create awareness, detection, treatment and prevention of cancer in operational areas of MSSS under the Diocese of Bhadravathi.

It was in November 2019 that the SPARSHA programme was launched in our diocese. Under the banner of SPARSHA we have done more than



26 awareness programmes in different places of our operational areas. The beneficiaries of this programme include the children, students, women groups, village people, tent dwellers, cancer patients, nuns and priests etc. On 4th February 2020 we have celebrated World Cancer day at Marshett Halli Holehonnur and Sarvodaya women's college Jayanagar by joining with other likeminded Organizations. In the end of February we have conducted Cancer detection and health camp at Annapura in Shikaripura Taluk in which 183 people benefitted out of it.

We have a palliative care centre for Cancer patients as well as connections with Hospitals in and around Shimoga which help us to conduct Cancer detection camps and

awareness creation programmes to the community. We have planned to work with like-minded Hospitals and Organizations and to continue this venture in a better way. The volunteers carry out the task of reach the different sections of the community in the villages. It also helps in mobilizing local support. The volunteers training programmes, Strategic meetings with likeminded organizations, Blood camps etc are organized on a regular basis for the effective functioning of the awareness programme.

In this monsoon season we are giving awareness among villagers and self help groups to promote organic farming and kitchen garden. People are encouraged to do so through free distribution of vegetable seeds and different competitions.

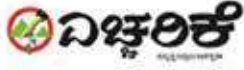
The nationwide lockdown which began on 24th March was the major preventive measure taken by India against the COVID-19 pandemic. It has impacted the mobility of the entire population of the country along with the enforcement of a series of regulations. This has hindered us tremendously that we are not able to organize the proposed plans for the campaign against cancer. It is indeed a painful situation that we are not able to provide any awareness to the big number of people against cancer by reaching out to them. We are afraid that the cancer patients are more vulnerable to this contagion as they lack the sufficient immunity due to the treatment they are undergoing. Sorrowful but true that we heard about some cases where the recovering cancer patients got COVID positive and could not survive as they lacked immunity. The present scenario has crippled us in such a manner that only a transient strategy could be proposed as we are unable to measure the unfathomable impact that has

been caused by the viral contagion on the health and the finance.

We are conducting awareness programmes by following the regulations of the government like the strict use of face masks and maintaining social distance in the group. The internet and the telecom services play a vital role in the present day to give awareness against Cancer as well as Covid-19. Also the psychological counseling offered through telecommunications gives them sufficient mental support.
