TOWARDS A PLETHORA OF SERVICE

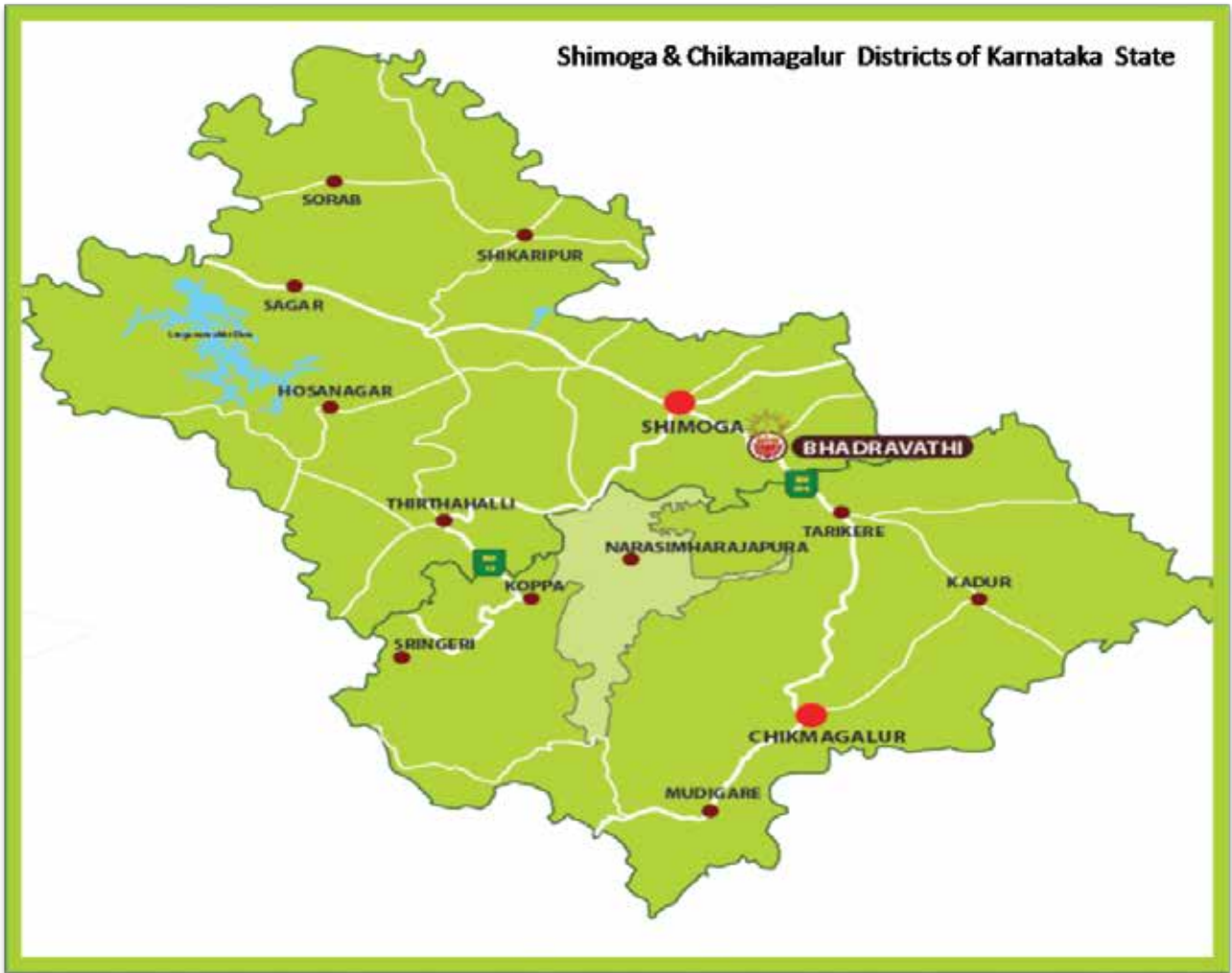

ORGANIZATIONAL PROFILE

Malnad Social Service Society (MSSS) is a non-profit, secular and non-political organization registered in 1991 under the Karnataka Societies Registration Act, 1960 (Reg No. 219/SOR/SMG/90-91) and Foreign Contribution Regulation Act under the Ministry of Home Affairs. It is registered under 12A and has 80G Tax exemption under Income Tax Act 1961. The operational area includes the Shimoga and Chikmagalur Districts in the state of Karnataka.

It is the social face of the Syro Malabar Diocese of Bhadravathi in Karnataka for facilitating a harmonious society rooted in the gospel values of love, justice, happiness and peace. MSSS has set its spectrum of activities through multi-ethnic and multi-religious with the objective to restore the dignity and potential of marginalized individuals. It began its social work in a charity mode and gradually

shifted to welfare and developmental modes. At present MSSS undertakes different Social development activities like education, health and human development activities including empowerment of rural poor, through the process of sensitization, capacity building, training and exposure with an integrated, need based and right based approaches. MSSS is giving importance to sustainable livelihood development of the rural families and caters to the needs of the people living with HIV/AIDS and Cancer.

The MSSS collaborates, associates and builds strong mutually beneficial networks with like-minded organizations and Government agencies for the betterment of the society at large. The participatory functioning of the Society is guided by its vision and mission based on the Gospel values under the guidance of the governing body.

ONGOING PROGRAMMES

1. CHILD HELP LINE -1098

The **CHILD HELPLINE** is a 24 hours toll-free phone service launched by the Government of India during the year 1998 – 1999, which can be accessed by a child in distress or an adult on his/her behalf by dialing the number 1098 on telephone. Child line provides emergency assistance to a child and subsequently, based upon the child's need, the child is referred to an appropriate organization for short-term or long-term follow up and care. It aims to create a Child Protection Network to reach out to every child in crisis intervention and link to long term comprehensive development. The MSSS is a Collaborative Unit of this noble cause since April 2011.

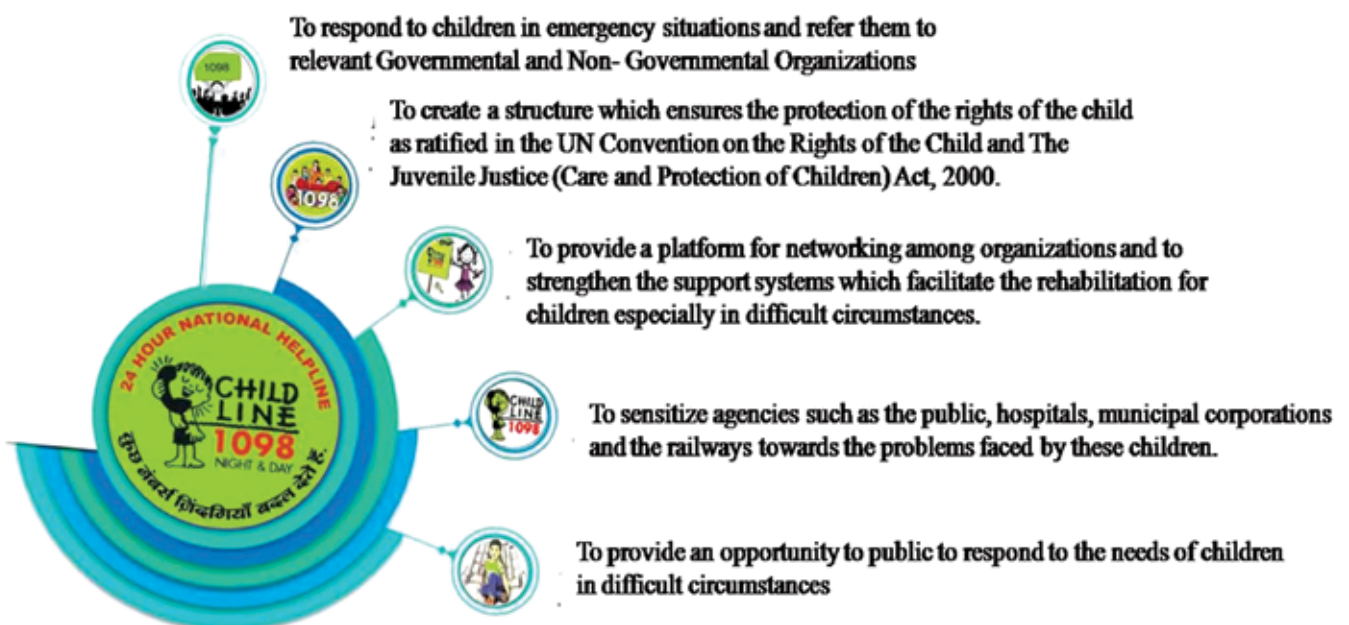
Mission

CHILDLINE will reach out to every child in need and ensure their rights and protection through the four Cs, Connect, Catalyze, Collaborate and Communicate.

The service focuses on the needs of children living alone on the streets, child laborers working in unorganized sector, domestic workers and sexually abused children.



The basic objectives of the CHILDLINE Service are as follows:-



Since the commencement of CHILD LINE Shimoga on 1st April 2011, it has played a very remarkable role in every aspect of extending immediate help and support to the child in distress. It responds invariably to every child who dials 1098 and provides emergency assistance through intervention and long term follow up. The collaborative organization responds to all incoming calls, 24 x 7 and renders the necessary aid. The Collab organization also responds when a concerned adult informs it about a child in need of care and protection. The primary role of the CHILD LINE Collab organization is to ensure effective networking and training of organizations associated with CHILDLINE and it ensures that the issues faced in responding to calls are addressed for effective functioning of the service.

CHILDLINE being a city-based program covers the entire Shimoga city and at times, it does intervene to cases received from beyond its jurisdiction; depending on the urgency of the cases. CHILD LINE Shimoga has a decade of its functioning in Shimoga and has played crucial role towards addressing the need of children in distress.

KEY RESULTS

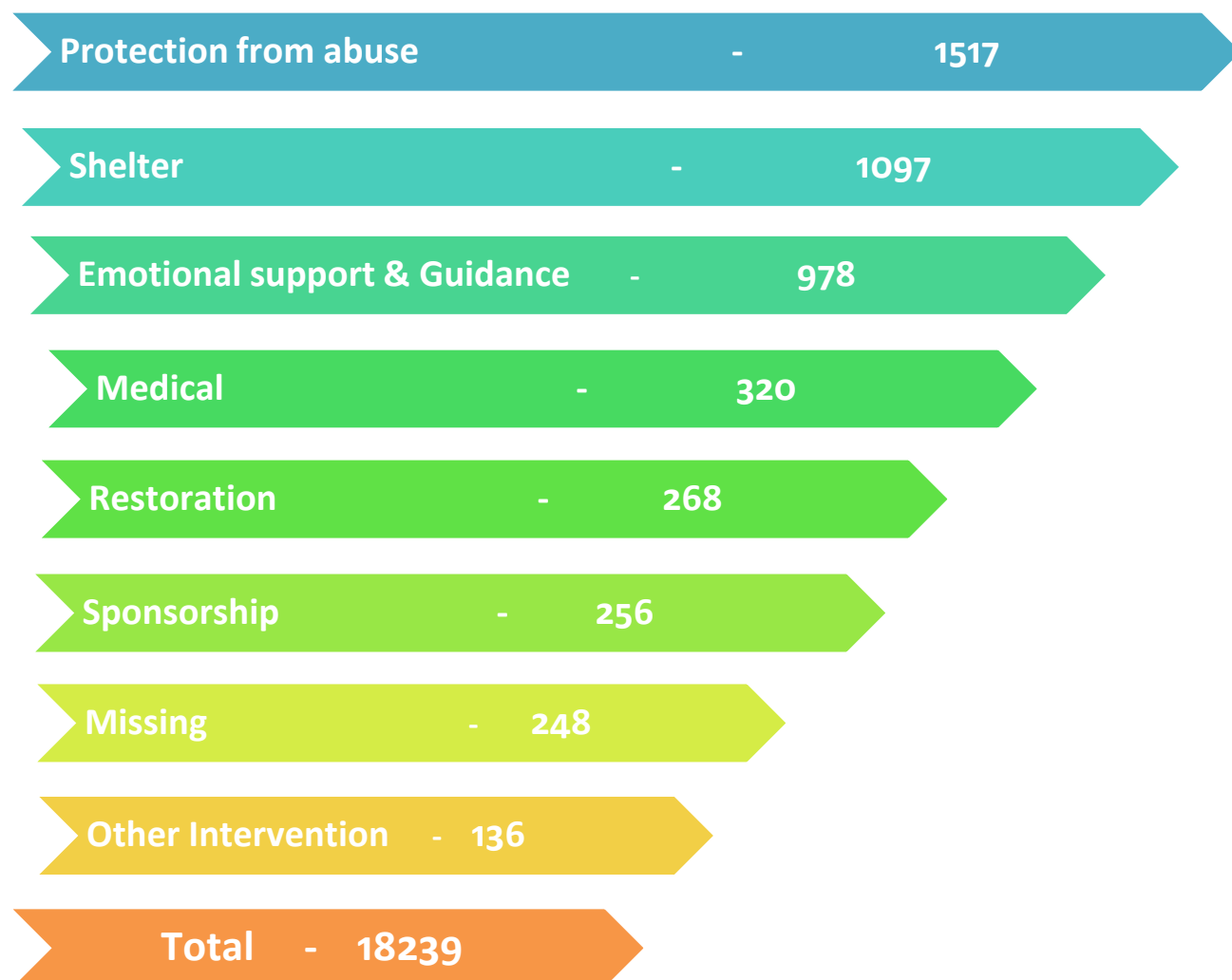
1. Total 581 calls received.
2. 441 direct intervention calls.
3. Support received from local resources organization for rescue and rehabilitation of children. With this intervention 74 children were rescued and rehabilitated.
4. Support received from child line department to prevent 67 early marriages in the district.

Call statistical and case intervention: -

As every call is important, Child line responds to each and every call based on child line's credo. Since its inception, CHILDLINE Shimoga has been receiving call from children as well as concerned adult responding cases of children in distress.

CHILDLINE aims at protecting the rights of children and ensuring access to quality service to the children who are in need of care and protection. CHILDLINE Shimoga has been able to render quality service to the children who contacted 1098 for various needs such as medical assistance, shelter, repatriation, emotional support and guidance, tracking missing children, intervening with children who have been physically or sexually abused, providing sponsorship and other interventions on child rights violations.

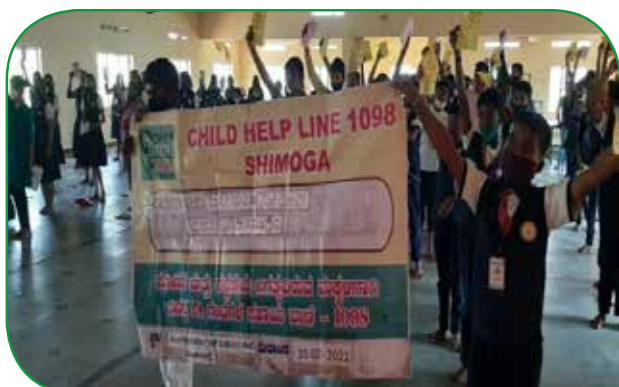
CASE STUDY

CHILD LINE CITY/ DISTRICT:	Shikari Pura Taluk Shivamogga
Name of the Child: Ananya (Name Changed)	Gender: Female
Age of Child: 14	Call category: CSA
Multiple interventions provided: Emotional support through counseling, Guidance, Medical support and put FIR	
Background of the Child: The child is from a poor family. Her parents are illiterate and she was pursuing her studies in class SSLC at Govt High School Bilaki Shikaripura Taluk	
Distress / Circumstances: Child was sexually abused by her neighbor (told two boy's name)	
Impact of child: A concerned adult from Shikari Pura Taluk called on 1098 asking to help out a 14-year-old girl child who was being sexually abused by her neighbor (name not told). He attempted to abuse her. After that the child informed it to her mother. Mother then approached the police station and registered a complaint against the suspected boy. It is at this point that the child line got information and CL team along with DCPU visited the police station and child's home. Counselling was given to the child as well as to the parents. Thereafter CL team members produced the child before CWC. Being understood that she needed professional counselling, CWC made arrangements for the same. Finally, as per the CWC order an FIR was lodged in the Police station by child's parents and CL team rescued the girl and admitted to Girl's home.	
Contact with CHILDLINE: Child's village public called 1098 & informed about the issue.	
Impact of CHILDLINE Intervention: The culprit is caught and the case under process. The affected child is given counseling to restore emotional and mental balance. The child also got medical support through CWC order. She continues her studies.

2. Covid - 19 Relief Work

The COVID - 19 pandemic which emerged as a health crisis also fueled up the economic problems for the poor people. As we have seen, it has been a fatal viral contagion killing people and capsizing the lives of many. All the segments of the population got affected but in particular the poor, older and sick are affected beyond proportion. The devoid of even the basic needs like food, water and shelter has aggravated their grave suffering in such a pitiable situation. It is very evident that the people are suffering and struggling to recover from this predicament. In the meantime, the second wave of the pandemic, which seems to be more deadly, has hit the nation, due to which the government was again forced to impose lockdown to contain the situation. As a result, many people are affected. The situation got worse where there were children, pregnant women and lactating mothers as they were deprived of the necessary nutrition.

Welfare Services undertaken

- The people were provided with ration kits, hygiene kits, medical kits, etc.
- Cooked food was distributed in the streets, to the tent dwellers, to the differently abled people, to the widows, to the needy and the poor.
- Awareness was given in the rural villages of 7 talukas of 2 districts. Pamphlets and posters were distributed. The online social platforms have been very instrumental in providing this awareness.
- The SHG members stitched cloth masks which are washable and reusable. This was also distributed among the people.

- Psychological counseling was provided to the people who were in fear and distress especially through telephonic conversations.
- With the helping hand provided by the generous donors we could reach out to the 9700 people providing them the necessary household items irrespective of caste and creed.

The beneficiaries would include the third gender people, country migrants, tent dwellers, pregnant and lactating women, old, sick, children and handicapped.

3. Women Empowerment Programme (WEP)

Women empowerment program is a project undertaken from KROSS and the main concern is to increase and improve the social, economic, political and legal strength of women so as to ensure equal rights to women and make them confident to claim their entitlements and live a life with a sense of self respect and dignity. Empower and animate women in our operational area to be effective leaders of the society by maximizing their participation in local institutions. The empowerment of women occupies a primary place in the activities of MSSS and is reflected in the vision of the organization. Organizing women into community-based organization for enhancing their social economic capabilities and federating to take up political tangents of accessing rights and entitlements are primary strategies that are used for women empowerment in our operational area. The overall goal of this project is the self-determination of women from particularly marginalized sections of society such as Dalits and indigenous people. Now they are able to jointly claim their rights from family to society.

The women are coordinated into community-based organization in order to amplify their socio-economic capabilities. The overall goal of this project is to invigorate the self-determination and autonomy of the women from particularly marginalized sections of society such as Dalits and indigenous people. Now they are able to jointly claim their rights from family as well as from society. The follow up of the IV Phase program scheduled from 01.01.2020 are under progress in order to achieve the goal and objectives of the organization to empower the women.

KEY RESULTS

- 112 Trainings conducted like health, environment, education, rights, existing laws & acts etc. 3694 beneficiaries gained knowledge.
- About 855 people have been made aware of the Covid-19 Virus.
- 1692 Beneficiaries have availed from 9 different departments 30 govt schemes received 13,26,078.00/ rupees.
- 17 Community benefits have availed roads, drainage, cattle drinking water tank 63,98,000.00/ Rupees.
- 417 Beneficiaries participate in gram Sabha, women gram Sabha, ward Sabha meeting and they discussed community issues, individual benefits & women issues.

- 57 Families planted 437 fruits and social forestry saplings their house & farms.
- 112 Women submit nomination for grama panchayath election, 91 women have participated in local election and 35 women have won local election.
- MGNREG work done 440 families received amounting 9,75,749.00/ rupees & 98 families get new job card from grama panchayath.

4. Women In Micro Enterprises (WME)

The very name of the project indicates its purpose of encouraging entrepreneurship among the women of the marginalized communities. The MSSS collaborates with SAMRUDI Rural Upliftment Foundation - Bangalore for the benefits of the women of economically most marginalized communities. Through this project loan is disbursed among the families through SHG up to Rs.25000 with lowest interest and affordable repayment installments. It aims to elucidate and motivate the latent businesswoman in the women of the marginalized communities. The SAMRUDI Foundation does this noble work as a service to the community. In order to attain the aimed result of the project, MSSS animators grade the SHGs and only 'A' graded SHGs are provided with loan facilities.

5. Navajeevan Community Care Centre

Navajeevan Community Care Centre is situated in Bommanakatte, Bhadravathi. Its services are paving the way among the people to prevent and to control the HIV/ AIDS in the two districts of Karnataka (Chickmagalur and Shimoga). Navajeevan Community Care Center is giving treatment to the HIV/AIDS patients, and conducting awareness and medical camps in the remote areas of the Bhadravathi Diocese. It also supporting HIV patients' families by providing food kits and study materials to their children. In the year 2020-2021 we could provide free medication to sick people in different places (Holehonnur, Moolakatte, Shimoga). This year we could provide medication to 345 patients, including 240 out-patients and 105 in-patients.

Palliative and Home Care

With the support of Catholic Health Association of India (CHAI) Navajeevan Palliative Care Centre focuses mainly on improving life and providing comfort to people with serious, chronic and life-threatening illnesses. Palliative care is an approach that improves the quality of life of the patients and their families. Palliative care focuses on welfare rather than the duration of life. Primarily palliative care is about giving pain management help to the patients with symptoms like loss of appetite, fatigue, shortness of breath and sleeping problems.

Last year Navajeevan Community Care Centre formed a home care team with a view to make our services available throughout the city and the villages. This team comprises of nurses, nursing aides and a social worker to provide necessary palliative care and non- curative treatment to patients and their families in and around Bhadravathi.

In the current year, we could support 245 patients through our Palliative and Home Care Centre. Around 16 patients breathed their last peacefully and with less pain. Around 5 -10 patients make use of the free services of this center constantly.

6. MAZDOOR SURAKSHA YOJANA

Mazdoor Suraksha Yojana is an initiative of Workers India Federation and Labour Commission of Catholic Bishops Conference of India, which is an insurance linked pension scheme for unorganized workers especially in the field of Agriculture and self-employed or daily laborers.

It is a government guaranteed retirement pension scheme named Swavalambana having central government subsidy of Rs. 1000 per year with a minimum contribution from the pensioners such as Rs.100 or above up to Rs. 12000. MSSS with the support of Workers India Federation got enrolled 543 pensioners in this scheme and last year 252 members have renewed their contribution & 6 members Completed 60 years and they took Pension amount.

7. SPARSHA

The power of a touch, a smile, a kind word, a listening ear, or the smallest act of caring is so profound that it has the potential to turn a life around. This is very much the charism of SPARSHA by which we instill hope in the people battling against the disease of cancer. SPARSHA is a campaign against cancer under the banner of Caritas India, New Delhi. The aim of this project is to create awareness, detection, treatment and prevention of cancer in operational areas of MSSS under the Diocese of Bhadravathi. The methodology adopted in this manoeuvre is emphasizing the change in the lifestyle of the people which will effectively serve in striking the ailment. With the support of Caritas India ASWS, we were able to spread the awareness on cancer. Nearly 4000 people are sensitized to adopt a healthy lifestyle through 44 awareness programs.

Amidst this pandemic many webinars were organized to alert and inform the people about the grave nature of this illness and the ways to fight against it. The beneficiary list of this campaign has a universal nature as it is open to all. Also, as the government relaxed the lockdown regulations many camps were organized in our operational areas.

The cancer detection and Health camps were conducted, the compatible hospitals and organizations came forward to be part of this noble endeavor mainly the Navajeevan Palliative Care Centre, Malnad Cancer Hospital, Nanjappa Multispecialty Hospital, Amala Matha Hospital team came to support us, 460 people made use of these camps. We have a strong team of the volunteers who are instrumental in carrying out the functions of this program in an effective manner. It consists of animating the people of the villages to support this virtuous cause. 70 cancer patients were identified through this campaign, 9 cancer patients were supported in their financial crisis and also the cancer survivors were facilitated. This has inspired them to motivate others. The volunteers training programs, Strategic meetings with like-minded organizations are organized on a regular basis for the effective functioning of the awareness program.

Organic Farming and Kitchen Gardening are the two initiatives which are held in high regard as it enables the people to have healthy food and life style. The free distribution of the organic seeds serves as impetus to cultivate vegetables in their gardens and open spaces. 545 families are practicing organic farming and nutritious kitchen garden. In order to mobilize local funds for this cause 1000 charity boxes are installed in the different places of the diocese. Along with these efforts the suffering people are provided with psychological and spiritual counseling both in offline and online manners.
